Dear Parents and Guardians,

It is wonderful to have students back in the building learning in person. Thank you for your patience and understanding with all the precautionary measures we continue to put in place due to the COVID-19 pandemic. To continue to mitigate the risk of another outbreak in our school, please have your child tested for COVID-19 if they become ill to confirm that COVID-19 is not the source of their symptoms. Ensure you let the school know ASAP if your child or a family member tests positive.

This semester we will have two evenings of parent teacher interviews that will be done through your choice of either a google meet or phone call. Our first set of parent teacher interviews are occurring on Thursday, March 18th from 5:00-8:00pm. Click Here to sign up for your interviews. Students mid-term report cards will be provided to you and your child on April 15th. On May 5th we will have our second round of parent teacher interviews. This will provide you an update on your child(s) progress further into the semester. Invites will be sent for those interviews at the end of April.

A Message from the Superintendent

In Chinook's Edge, we are continually looking at different assessment tools which convey the great accomplishments of our students and staff. Although some traditional measures of student achievement have been disrupted because of COVID-19, we can continue to look at a number of other indicators when determining student success. A series of success measures are embedded in our division goals:

- Academic Excellence: we are able to refer to data from grade 3 student learning achievement tests, grade 6 & 9 Provincial Achievement Tests, grade 12 Diploma Exams, along with PowerTeacher Pro Gradebook, student attendance and reading support level data, among other measures.
- Career Connections: our schools continue to refine their comprehensive plan of career exploration,
 planning and guidance for students in grades 9-12 and embed this work within school cultures.
- Social Emotional Well-being: school staff are utilizing our social emotional framework and our collaborative response model, along with a new vision for supporting students in the early years, to ensure the needs of all students are being met.

Among all the checks and balances in place, we believe success can also be measured in the resilience that our students have shown as they have made the shift to learning online as needed. We understand that not all families have access to adequate internet in the home, and we know parents are trying their best to support their child when they are required by COVID-19 restrictions to learn online from home periodically. Also, we encourage you to reach out to your home internet provider. Many providers have been very helpful in working with families to improve access, and they have also been assisting our technology department as they continue working towards solutions together.

What Is It? Each student who chooses to participate will write letters to his/her classmates, and collect letters from family and friends. The time capsule will be "unearthed" at the Last Bell of the Semester of your Grad year.

What Can Go In the Time Capsule

A letter from the student, etters and notes from parents, guardians, siblings, grandparents aunts, uncles, cousins, nieces, nephews, friends, family friends, neighbours, coaches, teachers and anybody that plays an important role in your life.

Photos and pictures or any memorabilia, including drawings, art, poems, and creative writing done by the students (anything that showcases current abilities)

What should not go in the Time Capsule Anything bulky (nothing thicker than photographs)

Things to Remember Letters can be in envelopes but please do not seal as each letter will be skimmed to ensure letters are directed to the correct student. They will be quality checked so there is no risk for bullying or negativity. This is not to be intended as an invasion of privacy, but rather to guarantee that each student has a positive experience. If student brings his/her own time capsule letters directly to teacher the envelope may be sealed.
