Our entire school will be walking to the NexSource or Centennial Park for an hour long Indigenous presentation that is part of our communities celebration of 1913 days. There will be a Powwow singing group, drummers, tipi's and knowledge keepers there to share some of the indigenous teachings and support our work towards reconciliation. More information as well as permission forms will be sent home shortly.

Graduation! On Saturday May 25th, we are looking forward to celebrating the successes of our graduating students with our pier photo, convocation ceremony and dinner banquet. At 9:00am our graduates will gather down at the lake for their pier photo followed by a grand march to the NexSource Centre. There were 25 plays, 76 actors, 53 technicians, and 129 participants in attendance. While we did not advance to provincials, we were awarded several outstanding awards. They included: Honorable Mentions in Set Design, Lighting, and Student Directing for Cole Joseph's production *Stressed*. They also won Best Ensemble which is equivalent to outstanding acting awards for each cast member. The same production also won Best

Artistic Design and placed as 2nd alternate for the provincial festival.

We also won an Honorable Mention in Acting for Skyler Umlah in *Horror Movie 101*, as well as an honorable mention for festival technician for Tatyanna Stoesz for *Electric Roses*.



IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM MR. GARROW REGARDING VANDALISM:

Administration Procedure 3-02 Vandalism to school Property There have been several instances of school vandalism this year. Please see the following information: 1. Student disciplinary measures (including suspension and expulsion) may be involved when a student is found responsible for damages. The Division may prosecute and/or take legal action. 2. Students, parents or guardians are liable for damages caused by students and may be required to make restitution. 3. The Principal is responsible for conducting investigations, reporting to the RCMP, determining the liability of students, obtaining estimates of the cost of damage, filing reports and ensuring proper restitution. We acknowledge that a very small group of students are responsible for the unfortunate decisions to vandalise our bathrooms, classrooms, and other areas of our school. These actions are not tolerated and students who chose to continue these behaviours will be charged for the damages, receive disciplinary measures such as suspension, expulsion, and will be forwarded to the RCMP for legal action. If you have information about vandalism at our school, please speak to Mr. Garrow. We assure you that any information will remain anonymous and your name will not be used in the investigation.

GRADE 9 TIME CAPSULE DO NOT OPEN UNTIL JUNE 2022 DEADLINE: JUNE 28, 2019

What is it?

• A time capsule! Each student currently in grade 9 who chooses to participate will write letters to his/her classmates, and collect letters from friends and family. The time capsule will be "unearthed" for grad in June, 2022, on the last day of classes.

Who is participating?

• All current grade 9 students.

What can go into the time capsule?

- Letters and notes from parents, guardians, siblings, grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins, nieces, nephews, friends, family friends, neighbours, coaches, teachers, and anybody that plays an important role in your child's life
- Photos and pictures
- Any memorabilia, including drawings, art, poems, and creative writing done by the student (anything that showcases his or her current abilities)
- Favourite sayings or mottos
- A letter from the student to him/herself

What should not go into the time capsule?

Anything bulky (nothing thicker than photographs; CDs could be included!)

Final Tips

• Feel free to place letters in envelopes, but please do not seal the envelope, as each letter will be skimmed to ensure that letters are not only directed to the correct student, but that there is no risk of bullying or negativity. This is not intended as an invasion of privacy, but rather to guarantee that each student has an overwhelmingly positive experience.

NEW: If a student brings letters for his/her OWN time capsule directly to his/her teacher, there will be no need to skim them, and envelopes may be sealed.

• While we hope that students take the time to write and collect letters, we do not wish for the time capsule to distract them from their class work or studying for final exams.

Where can letters be dropped off?

- Students may submit letters to any of their teachers, but there will be specific dropboxes in the following rooms English and social studies classrooms: Ms. Johannesson, Ms. Charanduk, Ms. Mielke, Mr. Hart, or Mr. Paul.
- Parents may send letters with their children, or drop them off in a clearly marked dropbox located in the office.
- **NEW**-email Ms. Wilson your letter at hj-timecapsule@cesd73.ca with the subject title TIME CAPSULE 2019.

When is it due?

• The final date for submissions is <u>JUNE 28, 2019</u>. After this, the time capsule will be locked, sealed, and stored in a secure area under the supervision of Ms. Wilson, until it is opened in June, 2022.
