Off Campus Learning Opportunities

Work Experience - Explore potential career paths and develop occupation related knowledge and skills that are not available in the classroom. You can use 15 credits from Work Experience to help you graduate. Every 25 hours you work is worth 1 credit. They add up fast.

Green Certificate - Apprenticeship-style Agriculture Training where you can earn up to 16 grade twelve credits while having fun learning about agriculture in a practical hands-on environment.

Dual Credit Courses

An opportunity to explore a career interest while taking a college course free of charge.

If you are interested in Trades, you will receive hands-on training in the same courses that students at Technical schools receive. By taking these trades courses it may lead to a job opportunity or the possibility of taking your first year of technical training for Welding, Heavy Equipment Technician or Automotive Technician while still in High School.

Online Dual Credit courses are available to Grade 10 through 12 Students who are motivated learners and who have the maturity to handle the responsibilities of course expectations and deadlines.

- If attendance concerns continue, your child's Principal or Vice Principal will work with you to determine supports that may be helpful at the school level (ie. adjustments in your child's schedule, etc);
- For continued attendance concerns, the Principal of Alternative Learning will connect with you to explore supports at the division level (ie. exploring Alternative Learning, etc).
