## My Alberta Digital ID (MADI) Account

# **Application & Admission Next Steps:**

#### **Admission Status**

#### Waiting for a Response

It can take days or even weeks/months for an institution to process your application, so try to be patient. If it's been a while since you've heard anything, try the following:

- Check your Junk or Spam folder to see if any correspondence has ended up there
- Reach out to the institution to see if you can get an update

## Pending

If your application is Pending, it's usually because the institution needs more information or documentation from you in order to come to an admission decision. Make sure to get them the information requested as soon as possible!

## Admitted (YAY!)

Congratulations! Most institutions will have multiple "Next Steps" for admitted students to complete, so make sure you know what those are and start working on them!

#### Waitlisted

The Waitlist is not the end of the world! Make sure you are prepared for a last-minute offer of admission, in case one comes. Also, consider ways you can try to ensure you get admitted if you reapply, like applying earlier or doing some upgrading to increase your marks, etc.

#### **Not Admissible**

This is also not the end of the world! Consider ways to meet the admission requirements or the competitive average, etc, in order to be admitted in the future.



# Post-Secondary Next Steps:

#### **Post-Secondary Institution Information**

Once you have selected an institution for your post-secondary training, you should research that institution further to ensure it meets your needs.

- □ I have reviewed the institutional Policies & Procedures, including Cancellations & Refunds
- □ I know how much post-secondary is going to cost me (tuition, books, rent, parking, etc)
- □ I know where I am going to live while attending post-secondary (at home, residence, etc)
- □ I know what kind of extracurricular activities are offered at the institution

#### **Registration Process**

You need to know if your institution will automatically register you in the classes you need each semester (automatic registration) or if you must register yourself into your required classes (self-registration). Self-registration is typically done on a "first come, first served" basis.

\*Registering as close to the "Opening Date" for your institution as possible will ensure you get a seat in the classes you want before they all fill up. Many classes are quite small or very popular, so you want to register early so you get a spot.\*



## **Financial Information**

#### **Preparing for Post-Secondary**

Make sure you are ready for your post-secondary experience and have done these things prior to the first day of classes.

- □ I have applied for Campus Housing, if applicable
- □ I have requested a Parking Pass or gotten a Public Transportation Pass, if applicable
- □ I have registered for Accessibility Services if I require any accommodations
- □ I have completed or participated in any relevant Orientation activities at my institution
- □ I have purchased my required books and supplies



## What to Expect:

## In the First Week

There will be a lot going on in the first week of school, so make sure you know these important things:

- □ I know what services and supports are available to help me and where they are located
- □ I know when all my due dates are and I have a plan for how I am going to stay organized
- $\hfill\square$  I have my Course Outlines and know who my instructors are and when their Office Hours are
- □ I know what activities are happening and will go have some fun and make some new friends

## In the First Month

You made it through the first week...way to go! As you continue in your first month of school, there are other important things you need to be aware of, including:

- □ I know when the Add/Drop Date is and will speak to an Advisor to make schedule changes
- $\hfill\square$  I am making connections both inside and outside of the classroom
- □ I have accessed any services or supports that I need and am being proactive asking for help
- □ I am staying on-top of my homework and am asking lots of questions in class

## In the First Semester

As you make your way through the rest of your first semester, it's important to not forget:

□ I know when the Withdrawal Date is and will speak to an Instructor or Advisor if I have concerns

about my grades in a class

- □ I am tracking all of my assignments, projects, quizzes and tests and know when deadlines are
- $\hfill\square$  I am aware of the rules and regulations at my institution and am following them
- □ I am sticking to my budget and have a plan to pay for my second semester
- □ I am taking care of myself, physically and emotionally
