Dear Parents and Guardians,

We have received some questions about whether Flex is mandatory. The answer is yes. Flex is designed to support our #1 school goal: All Lakers will reach their highest academic potential and our #3 school goal: All students will improve their literacy skills. This time is assigned for students to receive support from their teacher(s), complete homework, study, or read silently. Students find some subjects more challenging than others, Flex allows them to access a subject specific teacher to give them extra support during this time. Many students have commitments outside of school hours and Flex allows them to finish their homework and assignments as well as prepare for tests. Finally, if students don't require extra support, time to do homework or study then the time should be spent reading.

Research shows:

- Strong readers answered 70 percent more math and science correctly than students who were weaker readers, even on questions with low reading difficulty.
- Most students read less than 15 minutes a day. An analysis of more than 9.9 million students found that only those students who read <u>15 minutes or more</u> per day made accelerated reading gains.
- Reading reduces stress

All students are required to sign up for Flex first thing in the morning. Attendance will be taken during Flex. If students skip Flex then they will make up this time during their lunch or after school. Please see below the rooms and teachers available for both Flex blocks:


